The House is expected to consider: **H.R. 4128 - Private Property Rights Protection Act of 2005 (Rep. Sensenbrenner - Judiciary) (Subject to a Rule)**. In addition, the House may also consider Motions to go to Conference and Instruct Conferees on: H.R. 2528 – Military Quality of Life & Veterans Affairs Appropriations Act (*Walsh – Appropriations*) and H.R. 2863 – Department of Defense Appropriations Act (*Young {FL} – Appropriations*).
